Although the stories contained within the volume had all appeared in previous US collections, the book also appeared there

later in 1974 under the slightly different title of *Hercule Poirot's Early Cases* in an edition retailing at \$6.95. In the collection, Christie charts some of the cases from Hercule Poirot's early career, before he was internationally renowned as a detective. All the stories had first been published in periodicals between 1923 and 1935. Chief Inspector Japp asks Poirot to assist Scotland Yard in the strange events which took place at a recent costumed Victory Ball.
